

German Studies Minor Requirements

Required Units: 54

Prerequisites

The completion of two elementary German courses (at the 100-level) at CMU or the equivalent to those courses that can be determined at CMU via internal placement test scores.

Curricular Requirements (54 units)

1. Foundational Courses in German Studies (5 courses, 45 units)
 - a. 82-221 Intermediate German 1
 - b. 82-222 Intermediate German 2
 - c. 82-320 Contemporary Society in Germany, Austria and Switzerland
 - d. 82-323 Twentieth-Century Germany, Austria and Switzerland
 - e. 82-425/426 Topics in German Studies

2. Electives (1 course, 9 units)

In consultation with the advisor, choose one additional course taught in German or English for example, an additional 400-level course in German Studies, 82-282/82-283, or the Languages, Cultures & Applied Linguistics Seminar.

Curricular clarifications:

- Students who place out of one or two intermediate level courses must take additional courses at a higher level to complete the required number of courses.
- Students may double count up to two courses taken for the German Studies major to fulfill the requirements of other majors, minors and programs. Double counting with General Education requirements is unlimited.
- Ideally, students will complete the 300-level courses before moving on to the 400-level. However, there will be flexibility based upon scheduled offerings.
- At least one 400-level course must be completed for the minor.
- Study abroad is always recommended.
