Dr. Joseph E. Devine serves as the pre-law advisor for Carnegie Mellon University. Dr. Devine's primary appointment is as Associate Dean for Undergraduate Studies in the Dietrich College of Humanities and Social Sciences, with an adjunct faculty appointment in the Department of History. Dr. Devine earned a bachelor's degree in History (cum laude) from The College of the Holy Cross (1973), a Master of Arts in Teaching (History) degree from Stanford University (1974), and a Doctor of Arts degree in History from Carnegie Mellon University (1984). He served as History teacher-in-residence (1974-1977) at The American School in Switzerland in Lugano, Switzerland, joined the Dean's staff in Humanities and Social Sciences at Carnegie Mellon in 1979 as Director of the College's Academic Advisory Center; became Assistant Dean/AAC Director in 1986, Associate Dean/AAC Director in 1988, and Associate Dean for Undergraduate Studies in 2008. Other roles and responsibilities include Director of the Dietrich College Senior Honors and Student Defined Major Programs, Executive Committee member and teaching faculty for the CMU Washington Semester Program, and Secretary of the Carnegie Mellon Chapter of the Phi Beta Kappa Society.
